## 1. DESCRIPTION OF RECORD MONUMENT

1871 RECORD: Set a charred post for 1/4 sec. cor. with pits and mound as per instructions. (GLO)

1902 RECORD: Set a lime stone, 12x10x8 ins. 8 ins. in the ground, for 1/4 Sec. Cor., marked 1-4 on N. face and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, 1 1-2 ft. high, N. of Cor. Pits (GLO) impracticable.

# 2. DESCRIPTION OF EVIDENCE FOUND

A long-standing barbed wire fence, approximately 50-70 or more years old, runs East-West near the approximate search area for the corner. Found a spike in the side of a fence corner post approximately 130' East of the corner search area. Found no other evidence of corner location.

Used single proportionate measure to calculate the Easting (departure) of the corner position, and held the position of the long-standing East-West fence to determine the Northing (latitude) of the

Set a 5/8"x24" rebar with a 2" aluminum cap flush with the ground at the corner position. Cap marked as shown.
