

By mid-January the snow water content of the mountains of the Upper Missouri and Yellowstone river basins languished at around 75 percent, with the Bitterroot and Lower Clark Fork basins falling below 60 percent. The dryness of late fall and December prompted the Committee to further downgrade five counties along the west edge of the state to Moderately Dry over snowpack concerns. Generally, the water supply conditions are consistent with El Nino years of the recent past. But with a cool phase of the PDO persisting and present for the first time in many years during an El Nino event, records show that the cool overarching PDO may soften the warm and dry tendencies of the El Nino as winter progresses.
