Dear Mr. Yost,

As Montana's State Geographic Names Authority, I recommend that the Domestic Names Committee approve the proposal from Review List 400 to change the name of a peak in Hill County, Montana to "Brindle Calf Woman Butte".

The Montana Water Resources Division, the Montana Trust Lands Division, and the Indian Country Economic Development Program of the Montana Department of Commerce have notified me that they support the proposals. The Montana Department of Fish, Wildlife, and Parks and the Montana State Historic Preservation office have notified me that they are not opposed to the proposals. All of these agencies provided their recommendations without comment as to their reasoning.

The Hill County Commission has no objection to the change. I spoke with Commissioner Mike Anderson on the phone on January 5, 2010. He told me the Commission had discussed my letter of November 23 describing the proposal, and they decided they would not oppose the proposal.

I support the proposal because of the derogatory nature of the current name and because State of Montana attorneys have interpreted the "Squaw Name Change Law" as requiring the State to approve the HB412 Committee's decisions.
